### List of Civil Experts (Agriculture and Food) and Call for Nominations and Confirmation

### Note by the Co-Chair (JHAFG Agriculture and Food)

Reference:

AC/330-N(2017)0008-REV1 (INV)

- 1. Following the last call for nominations published on 22 May 2017, an updated list of civil experts for the JHAFG (Agriculture and Food) was circulated (at Reference). This list has been approved by the JHAFG on 29 May 2017. I particularly highlight the need for experts in the areas of Resilience and Contamination of Food Chain. To fill these vacancies, nations are invited to submit nominations.
- 2. In terms of requirements, the CEPC-agreed CEP Crisis Management Arrangements (AC/98(EAPC)D(2013)0005, MULTIREF) highlight the following:
  - Civil experts should, in principle, be nominated for three years.
  - Civil experts must be fluent in one of the two official NATO languages.
  - Civil experts should attend NATO training at least once every three years.
  - Civil experts should be ready for deployment at short notice. A civil expert should expect to be available at least once a year in support of a mission that lasts, on average, between 2.5 and 5 days. This could be as part of a Rapid Reaction Team (RRT) or as part of an Advisory Support Team (AST). In this context, shorter advance notice can be expected in cases where civil experts are asked to support an RRT.
  - We also draw on the experts' knowledge via contacts at place of business, i.e. seeking experts' specific technical advice via email necessary for policy developments. Depending on the area of expertise, civil experts should anticipate several inquiries of this nature, which may require up to several hours of dedicated time for completion.
  - The opportunities to involve civil experts are very much linked to the individual's field
    of expertise and also depends on experts' level of ambition and availability. Several
    experts are engaged in multiple missions every year.

- Nations are reminded that civil experts are required to obtain NATO SECRET OR NATO/EAPC SECRET security clearances for their civil experts within 6 months of appointment.
- 3. In support of NATO's implementation of the United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 1325 on Women, Peace and Security and related resolutions, and in line with the NATO/EAPC Action Plan in this regard (EAPC(C)D(2014)0019), women are strongly encouraged to apply.
- 4. At Annex 1, you will find the current list of civil experts, including the existing vacancies. At Annex 2, you will find the nomination form. On the basis of the nomination form, a cover letter from the sending national authorities, a CV and other relevant information (e.g. publications by the civil experts), the JHAFG Civil Expert Selection Team will review the candidates and develop a recommendation that will be submitted to the JHAFG for approval ahead of the next JHAFG plenary meeting.
- 5. Please also look at the experts already listed here and confirm that these experts remain available. A simple email will be sufficient, but much appreciated.
- Please note that the deadline for nominations is 29 September 2017.
